About the conference

There will be a half day symposium on 'The 24 hour society'. We are calling for papers on working hours, shiftwork, fatigue and stress, or any other relevant topic.

We are also seeking proposals for a debate. This was a lively and well-attended addition to the programme last year that we are including again.

All presenters must submit an abstract. All abstracts will be peer-reviewed for originality, technical quality, the topic's importance and clarity. Abstracts should be submitted online on the conference website at www.ehf2011.org.uk.

Author notification 4 October 2010

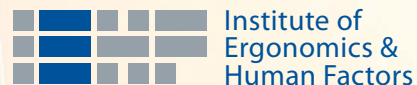
Provisional programme published 15 October 2010
